09 International Relations is a study of interconnected  
10 politics, economics and law on global level. It  
11 is a field of political science and interdisciplinary  
12 field of study. It is also a study of political  
13 entities and the wider world members and  
14 systems. The history of international relations  
15 based on sovereign states back often traced  
16 back to the Treaty of Westphalia of  
17 1648 a stepping stone in the development  
18 of modern state system.

19 International Relations Theories can be categorised on  
20 the basis of normativity. Empirical theories seek  
21 to explain why certain events and trends  
22 exist in world politics whereas normative  
23 theories are concerned with the events or  
24 or trends that should exist and to make  
25 ethical judgement accordingly. These theories  
26 are also divided into two epistemological parts -  
27 'Positivists' and 'Post-Positivists'. Positivists theory aims to  
28 replicate the methods of natural sciences whereas  
29 'Post-Positivists' rejects this idea.
