The authorities in London not willing to end their stranglehold over India, took during the freedom movement, the view that Indians were unfit to govern themselves, and that the governmental setup devised by them under the two Constitutional Acts of 1919 and 1935 should be enough satisfy their pol. aspirations.

But the Congress, which represented those aspirations considered the 'Act of 1919' as a "business down" and the 'Act of 1935' as "another charter of slavery". It took the position that only a constitution drawn up by a constituent assembly elected on the basis of adult franchise would be acceptable to the people of India.

On 19 Sept. 1945, about a month after the end of the second world war, the Viceroy, Field Marshall Archibald Wavell, announced that electric
