John Osborn was born on 12 December 1929 into a working class family of pub keepers. This was his mother's family; his father Thomas Osborne, who was a cmmercial artist, died of tubercolosis while Osborne was still a child. Osborne, though very attached to his father, did not spare in his play the 'genteel' middle-class to his father's family belonged. Yet he also mentions happy days spending his childhood with his paternal grandparents. He descibes his mother's family thus:

My mother's parents were publicans ... and whenever they got together for some celebration, there would be plenty to drink, however hard things were; that is something middle class people find difficult to undrstand or forgive.... There would be battling shrieks of laughter, yelling, ignoring, bawling, way that would embarras any middle-class observer. I've no doubt that they were often boring, but life still had meaning for them. Even if they did get drunk and fight, they were responding; they were not defeated.
