- 2) William Langland: Around the same period, William Langland composed "The Vision of William Concerning Piers the Plowman", another dream vision. This work presents a satirical society through an allegorical lens, a characteristic that can confound contemporary scholars and readers due to its intermittently clear and obscure nature. Langland employs unrhymed alliterative verse, distinct from the structured rhyme scheme of the Pearl Poet. The poem follows the journey of the narrator, Will, as he seeks to understand the nature of sin, virtue, and salvation. Despite its occasionally perplexing narrative style, "Piers Plowman" is regarded as one of the pivotal works of the late 14th century.
- 3) John Gower: John Gower, who was once regarded on par with Chaucer, is now generally seen as slightly inferior as a poet. Nonetheless, Chaucer himself named Gower "Moral Gower" due to his addressing of social upheavals in English society, such as The Peasant's Revolt of 1381, in works like "Vox Clamantis" ("The Voice of One Crying"). Gower's most renowned piece, "Confessio Amantis" ("The Confession of a Lover"), offers a critical examination of English society and religion, presenting a collection of tales similar to some of Chaucer's moral narratives in "The Canterbury Tales". "Confessio Amantis" is a collection of allegorical tales and moral instruction
