## \* Communication in Linux 81

### 1) write 81

The write command can be used by any user to send a message to other user. This command uses user-name as a argument for whose message is sending by sender.

Example:- write Jyoti ↵

```
Hello  
↓  
ctrl + d ↵
```

All executing this command the message would be display on the screen of Jyoti.

### i) msg 9 81

It allow a user to write a message or his terminal.

### ii) msg n 81

It does not allow a user to write a message or his terminal.

## Note

Super-user can write any message to any user to any message whether the user has been sent message 'y' (Yes) & 'n' (No).

## 2) wall

This command can be used only by Super-user.

Using this command a Super-user can send any message to all user who are connected to the system at a time.

The wall command resides in /etc directory.

Example:-

```
$ /etc /wall <
```

```
System is shutting down in 10 min <
```

## 3) mail

Using this we can quickly & efficiently circulate any vital information to any user whether the user is login or not.

Example:-

₹ mail amit , rohit el
